

From The Pastor's Desk...

By the time you read this, Easter will be a 2024 memory. There will also be a temptation out there even if it is subtle. The subtle temptation will be now that Easter is over we will focus on vacations, winding up our tax filings or moving from a BIG Holy Day celebration (Easter) to our interests and activities, unimpeded by the Church or our faith convictions.

If we have been celebrating or at least recognizing an essential aspect of our faith convictions, it is a relief for some of us to return to our agendas. Often embracing our own agendas can feel so much more gratifying than the "agendas" our faith walk impose on us.

The problem for us is that our faith calls on us to be engaged with our faith ALL the time, not just seasonally...not just when the church calendar may dictate.

Growth in our faith depends on constant engagement with the faith which leads to constant growth in the faith. To put it another way, if our understanding of our faith and the ways we "live it out" don't change and grow, there is a strong probability our faith has been reduced to a tool we use in ways that please us.


This quickly leads to a conclusion in a congregation that there is only one right and proper understanding of the faith (the way I understand our faith) rather than celebrating the various understandings of the faith found in any healthy congregation.

A basis of this congregational malady is to assert "the way I am used to doing things" is the only right and proper way...sometimes translated to "this is the way we have always done it".

The scriptures call us to a dynamic and vibrant faith, which as Jesus' own life Illustrates, grow, change, move and become different as we grow and change.

As we move from Eastertide to Spring (and EARLY Spring this year!), let us affix our eyes on the unknown future God gives us as well as celebrating aspects of what has gotten us to this point. Repetition only of "what has gotten us here" generally is not a reliable recipe to embrace an exciting, though unknown future.




*No Food Pantry in May June date TBD
