

From The Pastors Desk...

When you read this Easter will be close in time!

Lent has sustained us and hopefully helped focus us on the moments when we celebrate the triumph of the Divine over human efforts to control the Divine.

God chose to reveal His qualities and characteristics in the form of a person whose name was Jesus. God had unlimited options at hand as He made that decision. His choice was to reveal Himself through a person —Jesus, the Christ. That meant among other things that God wanted us to know that. He embraces and understands humans and human existence.

This was not done as some sort of impressive magic trick to show us humans the power of God. It was done to show us the fact that often, when God acts, it is in unexpected ways. The people living at the time Jesus entered the world were in despair. The time when God revealed Himself to humans 2000 years ago was a time of conflict and oppression of huge portions of humanity. The time was a moment in history when people had created their own ideas and images of what God ought to do to reveal Himself and begin work in human affairs. The way God chose was not in any of the ways people thought He ought to reveal Himself and become a present force in human affairs.

Our God ALWAYS surprises us in the choices He seems to make. God always seems to challenge us rather than wrap a cozy security blanket around us.

God always calls us as followers and believers who have made commitments to Him to follow as disciples...disciples who know we are NOT adequate to the tasks we will probably be asked to undertake. God calls us to difficult and often conflicting situations in which we are called to reveal the nature of God by how we behave...by what we do...not by the words we speak.

The life of Christ reveals these sorts of Human patterns. He suffered physically and emotionally and spiritually. He was nailed to a cross in a most humiliating setting between two criminals. There he died the slow death of asphyxiation.

The people with influence and status within the church of Jesus day thought he was gone and they put his lifeless body in a rented tomb.

Then, once again, God surprised the people of Jesus day...and still surprises us.


God showed that physical death is not the end. God showed that our "wisdom" about life and living was wrong. Jesus was raised from the dead and has returned even now to inspire and lead us and challenge us so that we can be the disciples God calls us to be.

Once again, we celebrate Jesus' triumph over death. We celebrate the renewed call to our discipleship...with all of the challenges and opportunities God is choosing to place before us. And we must know that God will present these (as He always has)...in ways that surprise us and transcend our expectations in order to accomplish what God seeks to accomplish...not what we think God ought to seek to accomplish.

May your Easter moments be filled with thanksgiving and celebration and surprise as God unveils our work of discipleship as His followers!

From The Worship Committee:

The Lord RESTORES My Soul

On February 24th, Fairgreen Women and friends gathered for a spiritual retreat at the Lial Renewal Center in Whitehouse, Ohio.

The theme of the retreat centered on a statement in the third verse of Psalm 23, "He restores my soul", with emphasis on the **restore.**

We learned that this word in Hebrew is "sub" which translate to: rescue, repair, fetch home again, relieve, and to turn back.

We also learned that from a shepherd's perspective, one of the most dangerous situations for a sheep is to have lain down and rolled over on its back. This position is called "cast" or "cast down" (from the old English). The sheep cannot right itself and thus becomes very vulnerable to watchful predators. The sheep has to rely on the shepherd to be rescued.

We talked about how, as humans, we also can find ourselves in cast down situations where we do not have the energy or knowledge or strength or ability to pull ourselves up. There are times when we need the help of the Good Shepherd, Jesus, to turn us around, lift us up, or repair us. (Psalm 42:5 in the NIV translation is a good example of how the cast down term is used in scripture.)

As an activity, at the retreat, the women were divided into three groups. At the end of this time together, each group was to choose one of three words given to them and create an acrostic poem using their understanding of what Holy Spirit had given them, from the study of Psalm 23. This is what resulted:

As you read through Psalm 23, there is a definite parallel between the relationship of a shepherd to his flock and to each of us as sheep with Jesus as our Shepherd.

During this season of Lent, let us each ponder as to how the Lord is our shepherd and as to how He is restoring our soul.

Information About Per Capita

Per Capita is one of the expenses related to being organized for mission in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). It is a responsible way of sharing costs that equitably belong to the whole Presbyterian community. Per Capita is not a tax or an assessment that imposes financial obligation. Rather, it is a **religious and moral commitment made by individuals and particular churches**. It establishes a minimum level of financial participation in the vital work of our connectional church as the Body of Christ.

As we work to finalize our budget for 2024, it is no secret that we will have a deficit budget. The Commissioners voted the following per capita contributions for our wider church:

General Assembly \$9.80 Synod of the Covenant \$3.25 Presbytery of Maumee Valley \$26.05

TOTAL \$39.10 Per Member

Fairgreen includes the total per capita donation for each member in our operating budget.

So, every member's per capita is paid in full regardless of the member's giving.

You are, therefore, encouraged to contribute your per capita giving beyond your regular giving. We pay our entire per capita contribution in January which enables the presbytery to meet their combined obligations to all of the governing bodies in a connectional manner. Prayerfully, please support your denomination at all levels with your per capita giving of \$39.10.
